- Download the PEAK App: Apply and check your status on the go! The PEAK app is available for download on iOS and Android devices for easy access.
- Call for Assistance: If you need help or have questions, the Health First Colorado Member Contact Center is available at 1-800-221-3943.
- Visit Your Local County Office: Prefer in-person assistance? You can apply or inquire about your Medicaid status by visiting your local County Human Services office.

Imagine Zero of Weld County brings together government agencies, community organizations, non-profits, and community members, all working together with the goal of suicide prevention.

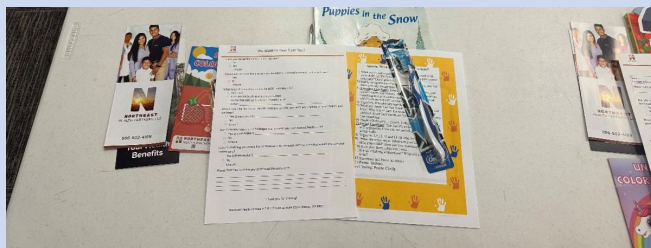
