

Managed Care Terms Explained

Appeal	The process you use if you disagree with any decision about your health care. If you lose your eligibility (coverage), are denied a benefit, or disagree with any decision about your health insurance, you have the right to file an appeal.					
Co-payment	A fixed amount you pay when you get a covered health care service					
Durable Medical	Reusable medical equipment used when there is a medical need for the					
Equipment (DME)	treatment or therapy for an illness or physical condition. Examples include oxygen, wheelchairs, walkers and bathroom or bedroom safety equipment.					
Emergency	When an illness or injury is so serious that you (or your unborn baby's) health,					
Medical	bodily functions, body organs or body parts may be in danger if you don't get					
Condition	medical care right away. This includes childbirth, labor and delivery.					
Emergency	Transportation provided in emergencies such as an ambulance. If you are					
Medical	having an emergency, call 911.

Emergency Room	Care provided by an emergency department anywhere in the U.S., twenty-four					
Care	(24) hours a day, every day of the year					
Emergency	Treatment provided by an emergency department

Excluded	Any program, product or service that is not included in your health coverage

Grievance (or	The right to complain about anything except a decision about your coverage or					
complaint)	pre-approval of services. If you are unhappy with your service or think you were treated poorly, you can make a complaint.					
Habilitation	Outpatient physical, occupational and speech therapies that help you keep,					
Services and	learn or improve skills and functioning for daily living. They always require					
Devices	pre-approval.					
Health Insurance	Covers your costs for check-ups or if you get sick.					
Health Plan	A group of doctors, hospitals or other provider who work together to get you					
	the health care you need.					
Home Health	Hospital or nursing facility services given in your home for an illness or injury.

Hospice (Care)	Care that focuses on comfort and support for people in the end stage of life.

Hospitalization	Care at a hospital when you stay overnight and are admitted.					

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Hospital	Care at a hospital when you do not stay overnight. Care in the emergency				
Outpatient Care	room when it is not an emergency.				
Medically	Includes any program, product or service that will (or is reasonably expected				
Necessary	to) prevent, diagnose, cure or correct, lower or help with your diagnosis				
Network	A group of providers that agree to give health care services and products to members in a plan.				
Non-participating provider	A provider, facility or supplier that does NOT give health services and products to members in the plan.				
Participating Provider	A provider that chooses to accept Health First Colorado members.				
Physician Services	Services provided by your doctor to help you feel better. These include physical exams, prevention services, and medical treatments.				
Plan	A group of doctors, hospitals or other provider who work together to get you the health care you need				
Pre-authorization					
or pre-approval	Getting approval for services before you use them.				
Premiums	Some members pay Health First Colorado a premium (monthly cost for coverage).				
Prescription Drug_Coverage	The medications that are covered in your health plan				
Prescription Drugs	Medications or drugs your doctor prescribes (orders) for you.				
Primary Care Physician	A doctor you have selected that helps you stay healthy.				
Primary Care Provider	A doctor or nurse practitioner (NP) who helps you get and stay healthy				
Provider	Physician, nurse practitioner, or physician's assistant giving medical care.				
Rehabilitation	Physical, occupational and speech therapies and devices that you need for a				
Services and	short time to help you recover from a serious injury, illness or surgery.

Skilled Nursing	Health care services you need that can only be provided or supervised by a				
Care	registered nurse or other licensed professional. A doctor must order skilled nursing services. Services may be to improve or keep current health or to stop health from getting worse.				
Specialist	A provider who works in one area of medicine, like a surgeon				
Urgent Care	Care for a sickness or injury that needs medical care quickly. First call your primary care physician.
