Food Assistance



Health First Colorado (Colorado's Medicaid Program) members may be eligible for SNAP or WIC benefits.



Programs

SNAP: The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program helps individuals and families buy food.

- The money is put on an EBT card, which looks and works just like a debit card.
- Children on SNAP qualify for Head Start- free school meals and funds when school is not in session.

WIC: The Women, Infants and Children program providing healthy food, nutrition education, guide to breastfeeding and community support for income-eligible people who are pregnant and postpartum, and families with infants and children up to five years of age. WIC welcomes all parents and caregivers.
