Approval of October 2020 Minutes	 Dave Madsen motioned to approve the October 28, 2020 meeting minutes, Penny Stumpf seconded the motion, and the minutes were approved without revisions. 	 NHP to post final October 2020 meeting minutes to NHP website.
PIAC Co-Chair Nomination Updates	 Reminded the group that the committee was seeking a member from the community to serve as Co-Chair to NHPs' Director of Quality Improvement, but unfortunately, the candidates nominated were unable to fill the vacancy due to capacity limitations. 	NHP will strategize an approach to soliciting a community member Co-Chair and discuss the approach with the committee during the April 2021 meeting.
Regional Updates	State Level PIAC Update – Joanna Martinson PIAC meetings for January and February will be held as closed-door retreats to allow PIAC voting members to review and reflect on the successes and challenges of the first 2.5 years of the Accountable Care Collaborative (ACC) Phase II. Joanna solicited and welcomed feedback from community members to relay back to the Statewide PIAC during the Feb retreat. Conversations held at the January meeting were related to improving Medicaid member onboarding and communications, COVID-19 vaccination efforts, and the current work of the Behavioral Health & Integration Strategies Subcommittee. Conversations scheduled for the February meeting will examine the structure of PIAC and its subcommittees to focus on alignment with the current healthcare landscape. Joanna encouraged the audience to participate in PIAC and its subcommittees to share regional experiences and explained the forums were a great resource for stakeholders and community partners to stay connected with what was happening across Medicaid in the state. NHP and Health Care Policy and Financing Updates – Mandi Strickland NHP hired a new Quality Improvement Director, Brian Robertson, scheduled to start on Feb. 1,	 Community members email Joanna with any regional feedback regarding local successes or challenges to share with the Statewide PIAC. Practice Transformation and Alternative Payment Model (APM) Overview	 Clinical criteria used to evaluate medical necessity Utilization management standards for the RAEs Provider network development efforts Education and training opportunities for providers Additional resources for reference Presentation (Robert McAlonan, Beacon Health Options) Robert explained the process and purpose of practice transformation for primary care providers. Focuses on a systematic approach to change using quality improvement tools and data driven metrics to help practices achieve goals and improve member care. Practice transformation coaches also assist primary care providers with HCPF's Alternative Payment Model (APM). Incentive program using a value-based payment model to reward provider performance. PCPs required to select 10 measures by Jan. 1, 2021. If measures are met on time, providers receive enhanced reimbursement rates. If measures are not met, providers receive a decrease in reimbursement rates. Three (3) types of measures: structural, claims, and eCQM. Due to COVID-19, no rate adjustments will be made for 2020 APM measures
