Regional Updates	 State Level PIAC Update – Joanna Martinson Review of the PIAC website and available resources and recruitment for vacancies on State PIAC. Review of RAE Dashboard. RAE 2 membership is at 81,150 this week. Discussion of Budget shortfall, programs under scrutiny and state approach. Executive Director, Kari Snelson added that there are some cost savings being realized due to utilization. Although RAE 2 has not experienced a significant decrease in utilization thanks to expansion of telehealth services. One of the programs that will end due to budget shortfall is the Healthy Communities program. The majority of this work will now fall within the RAE's domain to make sure members are getting the needed services available per the benefits. Diabetes Self-Management Education and Support

Presentation & overview (Joanna Espinoza with CDPHE)

- Diabetes is the 8th leading cause of death in Colorado.
- Controlling diabetes will help to reduce COVID 19 complications for individuals.
- DSMES is an evidence based program that reinforces the importance of Self Management.
- Individuals who are more proactive in managing their care help lower the overall costs of health care.
- DSMES is recommended as a best practice, consists of seven self-care behaviors and is a covered Medicaid benefit.
- There are four critical times for referral to the program: 1) Newly diagnosed members; 2)
 Annually or when not meeting targets; 3)
 Complicating factors begin to emerge; and 4)
 Transitions in life or care are occurding.
- There are DSMES services available in our region and a link will be provided to the map of those sites.
- Information was also shared for any provider who is interested in becoming accredited to provide this services. CDPHE is currently covering the costs of accreditation for interested providers, and will also provide technical assistance and support for practices throughout the accreditation process.
